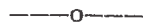

January 29, 1984

William Greene Raoul (d. 1913), a prominent Atlantan, provided for the establishment of an organization to work toward the eradication of tuberculosis—a disease which had claimed the life of his daughter Rosine. That organization, the Raoul Foundation, became the forerunner of the modern Lung Association.

Under the supervision of the Raoul Foundation, the fight against tuberculosis began statewide in 1913. The Foundation was instrumental in working to have the state legislature provide for the establishment of county health departments and the gathering of vital statistics. It began statewide health education measures and did case finding surveys employing one of the state's first public health nurses.

The Foundation pioneered social hygiene programs, began the movement for nursing services in county health departments, assisted in the organization of the Florida Tuberculosis Association, assisted individual patients, and conducted the Georgia Christmas Seal Campaign.

As efforts continued and Christmas Seal income grew, the Raoul Foundation turned over operation of the Christmas Seal Campaign and the tuberculosis programs to the Georgia Tuberculosis Association in 1921.

Since 1921, the work of the Lung Association has grown—changing from direct patient aid to preventive health education and research.

In our 71st year of service to the people of Georgia, we are moving into a permanent home. We can point with pride to the accomplishments of today in pediatric lung disease, adult lung disease, smoking and health, air conservation, occupational lung health and tuberculosis.

Building upon our rich tradition and record of accomplishment, The American Lung Association of Georgia permanently recognizes the contribution of W.G. Raoul, his family, and Foundation in seeking better health for all Georgians. We proudly name our permanent state facility the
